## **HURRICANE MILTON OCTOBER 2024**


As you all know, Sarasota suffered a direct hit by hurricane Milton earlier this month. The eye of the hurricane passed directly over GSHS. This newsletter is intended to describe the impact that it had on GSHS and how adaptable GSHS can be to always try to meet our patients' needs.

Since GSHS is physically located in evacuation zone A, we were forced to close on Tuesday October 9. However, before closing, we assessed the medical consequences of interrupting prescription distribution to our patients based on their current supply of medication plus their medical conditions. These patients were contacted so we could fill their prescriptions prior to closing on Monday afternoon. At the same time, we created a plan to address any prescription needs as soon as possible after the storm had passed. Since we were informed that it could be a week before electric services would be restored, this plan included a contingency of operating without electrical power.

Like everyone else in the Sarasota area, we anticipated damage to our facility but were also concerned with the safety of our staff and volunteers. We reached out to volunteers and staff (like family members would reach out) to ensure their safety and an obtain an assessment of damage to their homes. Although there was some property damage, our staff and volunteers had all safely weathered the storm.

Our attention then turned to how we would meet our patients' needs. Within 24 hours of Milton landfall, we were able to confirm that our facility had not suffered any significant damage. However, we did lose electric power. With the cooperation of our volunteers, we put together a plan to meet all our patients' prescription needs. This involved significantly more manual labor, but we felt that we owed this to our patients. Fortunately, electric power was restored within a couple of days and we returned to normal operations by October 15th.

It is reassuring to know that our staff and volunteers are always ready to adjust to the existing conditions to find a way to serve our patients.
